Why we're celebrating men this month



On November 19 it will be International Men's Day. Many people will be left wondering why men need a special day, when every day could be considered male. These types of official days tend to acknowledge and celebrate the 'underdog', and so this November celebration may raise an eyebrow.

What is possibly dusted under the rug, is that three times as many men as women die by suicide. Middle-aged men (40-49) have the highest suicide rates in the UK. In general, men report lower levels of life satisfaction than women according to the Government's national wellbeing survey.

Conforming to society's idea of what a man should be, some people refer to this as toxic masculinity. In some situations, this is unhelpful as it can perpetuate the association between toxicity and some male traits that aren't toxic.

Thus, the month of November is important for the masculine soul. It gathers several events that are important to men. Movember is the month we focus on raising money for men's health. On November 20 we celebrate International Children's Day which then forms 48 hours of celebration for men and children, and the special relationship they share.






