South Asian history is British history



In his mission to decolonise himself, Sathnam Sanghera demonstrates how so much of what we consider to be modern Britain is actually rooted in our imperial past through his new book, Empireland. Publishers, Penguin, is now donating 15,000 copies of #EmpireLand to British schools as part of its #litincolour project. In doing so they are highlighting how a diverse range of ethnic minorities have been central to the growth and prosperity of Britain.

The British South Asian community is over 3 million people strong, with at least 1 out of every 20 people in this country having South Asian heritage. From 18th July, people in the UK are celebrating South Asian Heritage Month, a month of activity to explore the shared cultures and histories of the UK and South Asia. South Asian Heritage Month (SAHM) exists in order to commemorate, mark and celebrate South Asian history and culture, as well as to better understand the diverse heritage that continues to link the UK and South Asia.

Although significant migration from our respective mother countries occurred during the 1960s and 70s, their relationship with the UK began hundreds of years ago. Soldiers from a collective India fought both World Wars for the British, hundreds of Ayahs were brought from South Asia to raise British children and eventually left at Kings Cross station with nothing but a pound. South Asians have contributed to all aspects of British life, from chicken tikka being served in pubs and garage music played on the radio to the NHS front line.

South Asian Heritage Month is an umbrella under which people come together to exchange stories, build relationships, or speak on the injustices happening within the community.

Shiva Raichandi, a guest from our LGBT+ Inclusion Matters Summit, is a multidisciplinary non-binary performance artist and content creator whose works harness the power of storytelling to create inclusive spaces for positive gender-diverse representation in especially for south Asians. Shiva freelances as a speaker and consultant on inclusive LGBTQIA+ practices for corporate and non-profit organisations, and runs a weekly dance class at Pineapple Dance Studios. They are also producing a fictional musical film, 'Queer Parivaar', which is based on an interfaith queer south Asian romance featuring an all-Asian, allqueer cast and crew.

Queer Parivar, Shiva Raichandani

Queer Parivaar (Queer Family) is a narrative film that revolves around the interfaith wedding of a queer couple, Sufi and Madhav, who are forced to face past secrets as a result of a mysterious person crashing their special day. The film implores audiences to reassess and expand their definitions and imageries of the words 'love' and 'family'. Some of the themes addressed in the film include non-binary gender identities, LGBTQ+ weddings, interfaith romance, familial bonds, chosen families, and intergenerational differences. In addition to this, Shiva will also be directing an official Netflix documentary on the wonderful Shane ShayShay Konno and their gender-diverse pan-Asian collective , #TheBittenPeach.

Shiva says: "As a non-binary Indian artist, this film is especially important to me as it spotlights the UK's queer Asian community with respect and in a positive light. Representation in front of and behind the camera is imperative to this project which will serve as an empowering lesson in solidarity by emphasising our shared commonalities while also highlighting our differences through cultural filters, especially at a time of rampant transphobia in Britain. And as is my practice, with every door I'm able to get through, I will bring people along with me."


South Asian Heritage Month


