

# We need to talk about Colourism & Texturism

In their new global research, Catalyst discovered that half (51%) of women from marginalised racial and ethnic groups experience racism at work, and that women with darker skin tones are more likely than women with lighter skin tones to experience racism at work.

Having physical features deemed as closer to Black, such as kinkier or more afrotextured hair, leads to further marginalisation, otherwise known as colourism and texturism. They are rarely spoken about within DE&I spaces, nor are the nuances of proximity to whiteness sufficiently explored. Our Brief has bundled a collection of resources for you to learn more.

The stark reality is that these prejudices impact health care with lighter-skinned patients treated more favourably than those with darker hues when seeking medical attention. Furthermore, they encourage harmful practices such as skin bleaching. And there remains outdated racist "professional standards" in the workplace too, meaning natural Afro styles such as braids, dreadlocks, and cornrows are often discouraged or altogether banned.




