

Pride Month: LGBTQ+ Lives as Symbols of Love, Freedom & Advocacy

Waves of anti-LGBTQ+ legislation and growing hostility towards queer communities are sweeping across the globe from the US to Uganda, Europe and Britain.

From banning gender-affirming care for trans youth to Florida's infamous 'Don't Say Gay' bill banning discussions of sexual orientation and gender identity in schools, American LGBTQ+ communities continue to be victimised and marginalised.

The UK government has blocked Scotland's planned reform of the Gender Recognition Act designed to make the process of obtaining a Gender Recognition Certificate easier. Earlier this year too, 16-year-old trans school girl Brianna Ghey was murdered.

And Uganda has passed anti-LGBTQ+ laws criminalising homosexuality and proposing jail terms for those advocating for or promoting LGBTQ+ rights.

Now more than ever, we must embrace Pride as a protest, and champion LGBTQ+ communities and voices to work in partnership with them to build safer and more inclusive spaces.
